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Breadfruit Varieties | Otea

NOTES: The pale yellow, creamy flesh is solid and dense and has a firm, yet tender, texture when cooked. This tree is generally more compact than other Polynesian varieties, but tends to produce more prolifically. Otea has a good potential for commercial production of chips and other products.
