A shorter, more compact tree than other varieties. Small-fruited. The creamy to pale yellow flesh is not as dense or firm as typical Polynesian varieties and exhibits a tender texture when cooked.

Shape: Oval

Skin Texture: Slightly rough, irregularly raised, flattened to sandpaper

Weight (kg): 0.6–1.1

Average Weight (kg): 0.8

Length (cm): 12–16

Width (cm): 10–13

Average Size (cm): 14 x 11

Core size (cm): 9 x 3

Seeds: Generally seedless, occasionally 1 or more seed per fruit

fruiting season

July–December, some off-season fruiting in January–May
